



# THE IN HIM LIFE

## THE IN HIM LIFE!

Acts 17:28 says, "*In Him we live, move and exist.*"

One of the first questions we are to ask ourselves as followers of Jesus is, what is this "in Him" position or posture?

The second question then is, what does it mean to live, move and exist from it?

To not know the reality of the first question through divine grace is to not know the reality of the second question and so what we are left with, is trying to live this life of eternal truth from the spirit of self.

We might know through revelation the position of Jesus in me, but what is this position of me in Jesus?

To only know the position of Jesus in me, is to only know half of the equation to life in Christ. In only knowing half of the equation, we will be void of the full measure of life in Christ, which we can know and live from now.

In the verse above we can see it's not Christ in us we live, move and exist, but it is in Christ we live, move and exist. There are two parts to this one reality of life in Christ.

1. Christ in me
2. Me in Christ

This in Him life is a position of deep fellowship with the Father, Son and Spirit, while the Christ in me position is only a relational position in the Father, Son and Spirit. We have to be able to discern the difference between these two positions.

They both exist in God but they are different from one another.

We are called into fellowship with God as the primary objective. The 'Christ in us' position



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of relationship is to propel us into the 'in Christ' position of fellowship. In others words a divine union with the Father and the Son as per 1 John 1:3.

***1 Corinthians 1:9 God is faithful, through whom you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.***

***1 John 1:3 what we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ.***

***1 John 1:6-7 If we say that we have fellowship with Him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth; but if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.***

Are you able to discern the difference between fellowship with God and His followers and a relationship with God and His followers? You can have and be in a relationship with God and fellow believers through the blood of Jesus, but have no real fellowship, or spiritual oneness with God and fellow believers. As we looked at in 1 Corinthians 1:9, we are called into fellowship and we are to be devoted to fellowship with God and as an outcome of this we have fellowship with one another.

This is the fruit of an in Him life, not a Him in us life.

***Acts 2:42 They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.***

This in Him life produces in us a life that is full and overflowing with rivers of living water. It's a life void of lack or drought, it is continuously progressing, moving from one measure of life to another within us.

It's the inner life that drips with abundance and blessing, where there is always more than





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enough eternal fruit for everyone to receive and still have plenty left over. This in Him life is where we started life before the foundations of the earth, before the fall of humanity. It's where we had our beginning and it is this position which the Father is returning us to through the power of grace.

***Ephesians 1:4 just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we would be holy and blameless before Him. In love***

There are many scriptures that declare that it is within this 'in Him' position that the prophetic eternal life of God exists, waiting for God's people to access and possess it. Here are just a few of these scriptures.

***Ephesians 2:6 and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus,***

These heavenly places which we are to be seated in are in Christ Jesus.

***2 Corinthians 1:19-20 For the Son of God, Christ Jesus, who was preached among you by us—by me and Silvanus and Timothy—was not yes and no, but is yes in Him. For as many as are the promises of God, in Him they are yes; therefore also through Him is our Amen to the glory of God through us.***

Where are these promises discovered?

***John 17:11-12 I am no longer in the world; and yet they themselves are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep them in Your name, the name which You have given Me, that they may be one even as We are. While I was with them, I was keeping them in Your name which You have given Me; and I guarded them and not one of them perished but the son of perdition, so that the Scripture would be fulfilled.***

Jesus prays to His Father that He will keep the disciples in His name. He says while I was with them I was keeping them in your name.

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***Philippians 3:14 I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.***

Where is this upward call?

We can see this 'in Him' reality is declared throughout the Scriptures and it is a reality we must carry a living knowledge of, so our lives are being divinely built by God in accordance to it. It is a reality we enter into through God's divine grace. It is a spiritual dimension that exists behind the veil and only those priests who are truly willing to lose their entire life for Christ's and the gospel's sake will find it.

Wilderness people abide in this 'in Him' life, it is their fixed abode. This is the place they live their lives from. The 'in Him' life has no beginning of days nor end of life. It is not of a natural bloodline and has no mother, father nor natural genealogy. It is purely an eternal life discovered in the One who is Eternal.

***1 John 5:11-12 And the testimony is this, that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has the life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have the life.***
